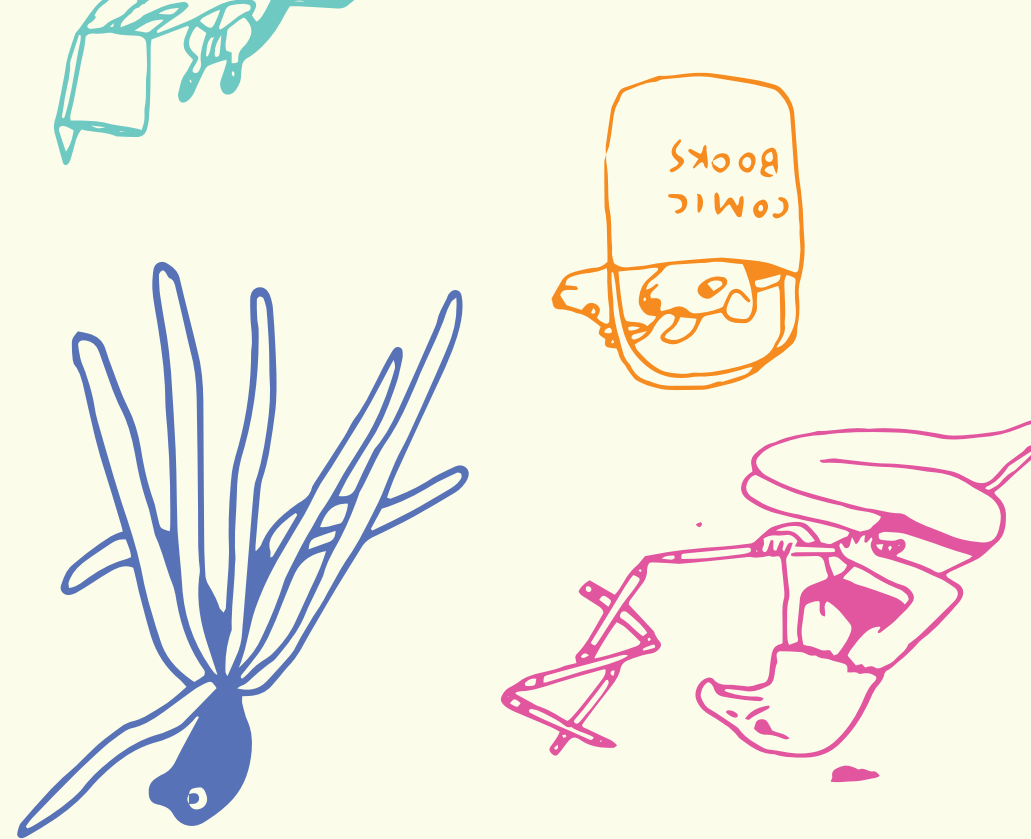

Canadian comics artist and illustrator Michael DeForge's unique characters and hallucinatory artwork has made a huge mark within the alternative comics world. He currently works as a designer for Cartoon Network's *Adventure Time* as well as working on his own independent projects.

Founded in 2012, ELCAF's aim is to introduce and celebrate both small press publications and the dynamic community of individual artists and collectors that are pushing the boundaries in comics, illustration, graphic and sequential art here in the UK and abroad. Each year ELCAF has seen an incredible growth; larger venues, more exhibitors, and a greater number of people coming through the doors.

As a result, ELCAF 2015 is now held over two days and will include an extended programme of events. In addition to our trademark workshops and talks during the two days of ELCAF itself, we ran a new series of Masterclasses in collaboration with House of Illustration and held a satellite exhibition and workshop by Spanish artist Ricardo Cavolo at NOW Gallery's Urban Village Fete in May.

The *Animator as Artisan* consists of two reels of animated shorts curated by Flatpack Film Festival for ELCAF. The first, *Drawing Conclusions* explores animators using their hand-drawn skills (albeit with computers involved too). This eclectic roundup of international award-winners spans experimental, sci-fi, comedy, and drama, showcasing the very best in contemporary world animation.

This exhibition was curated by Hamelin Cultural Association in April and re-created by ELCAF for SPACE gallery. It is presented in collaboration with Transbook Children's Literature on the Move and Hamelin Cultural Association.



ELCAF is pleased to present Steven Guarnaccia's exhibition, *Fatherland*. Guarnaccia's childhood, family history and fraught relationship with his father are the themes of this exhibition. The show features a series of transformed objects, which Guarnaccia dedicates to the memory of his father: painted shoes, vests, pipes, duckpins and rusty saws, along with wooden shirts and paper neckties made by the artist. Guarnaccia embelazons these objects with patterns, puns and emblematic phrases from his childhood. The objects suggest a narrative, an interplay of images and words that explore notions of memory, father-son relationships and coming of age.
